

POST OPERATIVE PATIENT INFORMATION Direct Laryngoscopy / Vocal Cord Stripping

- 1. Absolute voice rest will be required for the first 72 hours after surgery if a biopsy is done. This means NO talking and NO whispering. You must write notes for all necessary communications. You will be notified if this is required of you after surgery.
- 2. When talking is allowed, you should speak normally--no whispering. Do not talk loudly at first. Do not strain your voice. Try not to talk to anyone more than 5 feet away from you.
- 3. No dietary restrictions are necessary. You may resume your normal diet. Avoid alcoholic beverages for 24 hours.
- 4. Minimal discomfort is associated with this procedure. Tylenol tablets (over-the-counter) should help with any sore throat sensation you may have for the first 24 to 48 hours after the procedure.
- 5. Avoid cigarette smoking, or exposure to smoke filled environments. If you are a smoker and wish to stop, please discuss this with your primary physician. Ask about it at your follow-up visit.
- 6. Anyone having a general anesthetic should not participate in any activity requiring mental alertness, physical coordination, or balance for 24 hours after the anesthetic; i.e. driving, bicycling, etc.

Your first postoperative office visit will be approximately one week from the date of your surgery. Call the office to schedule a date and time, if this was not already scheduled.

If you are uncertain about any of the above items or have any questions, please contact our office at (702) 834-5886 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. After hours, if you have an emergency, go to the emergency room or call the office number and you will be connected to the on-call physician.
